☞ **OUR SCHOOL STAFF IS COMMITTED TO:**

- Communicating with parents and students regarding academic progress, attendance and behavior through interim reports and report cards (4 each per year), parent/teacher conferences (11/21/16, 11/22/16, 11/23/16, 3/9/17 & 3/10/17), Friday Folders (weekly), GES newsletters (biweekly), agenda book/homework folders (daily), notes/phone calls/emails as needed. Interpreter services and translated documents are always available.
- Offering parenting workshops and in-services on topics promoting the academic achievement of their children. See the flip side of this paper for a calendar of events. Post at home for future reference.
- Establishing firm and fair behavior expectations that will reward positive learning behaviors (schoolwide PBIS program).
- Providing high quality curricular experiences as we implement the Maryland College and Career-Ready Standards (MDCCRS)...(See our "Partners In Learning" attached)

☞ **EXTENDED DAY OPPORTUNITIES:** Some of our children will qualify for educational opportunities that extend beyond the regular school day. These opportunities include:

- Math Tutoring - This is generally done two days a week.
- BRIDGES Program-This is an after school program that focuses on math and reading skills for students in grades 3-5. Students are involved in academic support and hands on, engaging enrichment activities {Funded by 21st Century CLC grant}.
